King's Award for Voluntary Service -Dave Barratt

It was during the summer of 2022 that I was originally approached to say that my voluntary group, Milton Keynes Green Gym, had been nominated for (what was at that time) the Queen's Award for Voluntary Service. I was asked to supply various pieces of information by the office of the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire and was advised that many groups are nominated, an honour in itself, but that the award itself was far from certain.

Over the following weeks there were further requests for information and then, in September

2022, Queen Elizabeth II died...and everything stopped. It was not known if, or when, the award might continue. It was not until the early part of 2023 that it was confirmed that King Charles III wished the award to continue as the King's Award for Voluntary Service (KAVS). As 2023 progressed there was continued contact with the KAVS office, which I took as a good sign that we were still in the running, including notification that the awards would be delayed until 14 November 2023, the King's 75th birthday. However, it was not until early October that I



was advised that we were one of 262 groups across the whole of the UK to receive the award for 2023...but that I couldn't tell anyone until it was made official. It was a long 6 weeks.

The award is considered to

be the equivalent of an MBE for volunteer groups. It takes the form of a certificate, signed by the King, and a crystal engraved trophy. Both were presented during March 2024, by the Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire, the Countess Howe at the City Discovery Centre, Bradwell Abbey. *(Photo credit Graham Jones)*



Receipt of the award entitles the group to display the KAVS logo on our website, Facebook page etc.

The final part of the award was that two of us were invited to attend a garden party at Buckingham Palace in May 2024. Along with one of the volunteers, Angela, we travelled down to London on a rather grey and overcast Tuesday afternoon. The weather deteriorated the further south we went, so by the time we arrived in central London it was properly raining, which was a shame, but we didn't want the weather to spoil the experience.



We met some lovely people from other groups, the gardens are impressive (we weren't required to do any weeding), the afternoon tea was splendid, and we did a touch of Royals spotting, including the Prince of Wales, who was hosting the event on behalf of his father.

Our first speaker is lan Sterling from **The Milton Keynes Safety Centre** also known as Hazard Alley. He is with us to talk about the world's first interactive indoor safety education centre which was planned and established in 1992. Originally conceived by Bucks Fire & Rescue Service & Thames Valley Police, it aimed to introduce children to risks, dangers and hazards in a totally safe environment. Since it opened it has hosted half a million children as well as inspiring other centres across the UK.

Our second speaker for June is Nick King from **The Milton Keynes Neighbourhood Watch**. Neighbourhood Watch is a voluntary organisation which is about helping to reduce crime, helping to reduce the opportunity for crime and about reducing the fear of crime throughout Milton Keynes and surrounding areas.

It is also about building community spirit by bringing people closer together with common goals primarily through Watch Schemes.

Our venue is Oak Tree Centre, Wallinger Drive, Shenley Brook End, MK5 7GZ. Doors open at 2:00pm for a 2.30pm start. Coffee, tea and biscuits are available after the talk. There is a £1 charge for members and £2 for visitors.

Kew Gardens – Thursday 22 August

Pick Up Point: MK Coachway 8.30am **Arrive:** Kew Gardens Elizabeth Gate 10.00am approx.

Depart: Kew Gardens 4.30pm

Cost: £33 including entry to Gardens, coach hire and driver's tip Closing Date for Booking 5 August

London's largest UNESCO world heritage site offering unique landscapes and iconic architecture from every stage of the gardens' history.

The day is yours to spend at leisure wandering the various gardens and greenhouse. The garden dates back to the early 18th century as a royal palace to today's renowned scientific institution for plants and fungal research.

There is throughout the gardens and greenhouses an exhibition of sculptures by Marc Quinn, exploring the relationships between people and plants. There is a Land Train that has stops around the garden at various places. The cost is £6.50 with trains from 11.00am. Tickets have to be booked at the first stop, Victoria Gate; it is not possible to purchase tickets at other stops. The preferred method of payment is by card, however they can accept cash with people paying at the till points at Victoria Gate. The price is for the whole day as long as there is space on the train. Tickets are on a first come/first served basis. Capacity on the train is for 50–55 people.

There are multiple wheelchairs at every gate on a first come first served basis.

10 mobility scooters can be hired in advance. Once you have booked your place on the Outing please telephone 020 8332 5121.

MK COACHWAY

The access road to the Coachway for those coming from the east of the city across the M1 is closed, temporarily, to vehicles and pedestrians to allow HVSS to carry out excavation of a dual 33kV circuit as part of the main scheme from MK East to Bletchley. It will be closed from 3/6 to 30/8. Whilst the closure is in place the alternative route will be via Newport Road/Fen Street.
