A Literature Class in Milton Keynes – January to March 2022

This class should appeal to many mku3a members who are keen on discussing good literature with a more structured format than is found in book groups. The tutor, **Karen Hewitt**, taught regularly for Oxford University Department for Continuing Education, but a change of policy by OUDCE and the WEA has meant that she is now running these classes independently with a continuing group of about a dozen class members.

The Fiction of Mikhail Bulgakov – a Russian genius

The coming term's class will be devoted to *A Country Doctor's Notebook, The White Guard,* and *The Master and Margarita* by Mikhail Bulgakov. We will discuss Bulgakov's dramatic and narratives skills, the acute memories of his time as a country doctor, his exploration of the Civil War in Kiev in 1918, his recreation of the Pilate story, the culture of Soviet Moscow, and the spiritual questions that he demands of himself. His writing is very readable and yet complex. His fiction has been brilliantly translated by Michael Glenny (Vintage Classics).

Time and Place The class will be held on Mondays from 10.00 to 12 noon **starting on 10**th **January 2022.** It will last for 10 weeks with a half term on Monday, 21st February. Last term the class was held in the comfortable **Methodist Church Hall in Stony Stratford**. Covid permitting, we will continue at Stony Stratford, otherwise we will shift to Zoom.

Day 1: 8am pick-up at Milton Keynes Coachway M16 Exeter (190 miles), stopping en route at Montacute Hot (montacute@nationaltrust.org.uk). This glittering Elizabethan mansion is adorned with riches that exude wealth and power and the compartmentalised gardens are quite unique.
