Exploring World Faiths group visit to the Greek Orthodox Church in Stony Stratford

At the beginning of May the group visited the Church of St. Ambrosios and St. Stylianos. We were warmly welcomed by Niki Beales who is vice-president of the Church. Niki gave an interesting talk on the Orthodox Church beliefs, customs and practices including the ceremonies surrounding birth, baptism and marriage. The Orthodox Church is Victorian (built in 1860) and used to belong to the Church Of England (St. Mary the Virgin). It is a grade 2 listed building. It became unused as a Church and later became a community centre. The Greek community acquired the building in 2010 and carried out renovations.



The Greek Orthodox Church is a religion rooted in tradition and in preserving Greek identity. They have their own Greek language school which provides tuition for children. The Church is decorated throughout with beautiful icons which is holy and sacred art, rich in symbolism and is used in prayer.

A most enjoyable visit where group members increased their knowledge of Greek Orthodox religion, faith and culture.

York Mystery Plays

It has been a privilege for me to give a presentation, in the pre-covid past, to MKu3a, on the subject of the *York Mystery Plays* and how seven (or is it now eight?) Guilds of York stage the plays in mediaeval form, played on waggons on the streets of the City.

If I managed to raise any interest, then this summer gives you the opportunity to see the real thing. The guilds are producing eight of these bible stories in a two hour(ish) production in two formats:

- Sundays 19th and 26th June. The pageant waggons will roll around York to four 'stations', three of these being free street sites (you can pick one site, or follow the plays from one to another) plus a fourth site with covered raked seating requiring paid tickets;
- Wednesdays 22nd and 23rd June there are evening production, with limited ticketing, in York Market, adjacent to the Shambles.

The chosen plays are:

- Creation to the Fifth Day, for the Guild of Building. The Builders' waggon is a masterpiece of mediaeval technology.
- The Fall of Man, for the Guild of Freemen. Come and boo Satan!
- The Building of the Ark and the Flood, for the Guild of Cordwainers. Mrs. Noah can't understand her husband.
- The Three Kings and Herod; for St. Luke's Church. Very dark.
- The Last Supper, for the Company of Merchant Taylors, played by the Lords of Misrule (the players of the <u>Centre for Medieval Studies</u> (link), University of York) whose interpretations are always fascinating.
- The Crucifixion and the Death of Christ; for the Gild* of Butchers; two mediaeval plays brought together and played on a waggon build by the Gild.
 - * My own guild, and therefore by convention of the York Guilds, I use the alternative spelling of 'Gild'.
- The Appearance of Jesus to Mary Magdalene, for the Guild of Scriveners, in conjunction with the recently formed, modern, Guild of Media Arts; New Hope in the World!
- The Last Judgement; for the Company of Merchant Adventurers; Will you go to heaven or hell?
