And we are thrilled to be joined by Alexander Olleson, BBC Young Chorister of the Year 2020, who will be singing the solo treble part.

Lux Aeterna (eternal light) by Morten Lauridsen, the American choral master, was first performed in 1997, and comprises five movements based on sacred Latin texts.

Josef Rheinberger wrote many choral works and his Requiem in D minor is full of rich textures and flowing melodies.
