Help Needed!!

We have received this request from an outside body and are sharing the information. if you are interested please contact Wynsdale Environmental directly.

We are Wynsdale Environmental (<u>www.wynsdale.co.uk</u>) and this summer we are looking after two events at Campbell Park, the first is on 22nd July (and possibly 23rd) and the second is on 29th to 31st July inc.

As we are based in Kent, we need to supplement our core team with reliable local people and I'd like to thank the committee for allowing us the opportunity to approach the members of MK-U3A.

What needs to be done? We are carrying out litter picking and a few other services for the events.

When do we need you? We provide services in the run up to the event, on the day of the performance, and then afterwards when the venue is cleared.

How many people do we need? We need varying numbers for different shifts, so at this stage we are looking to see who is interested and we can then tailor the hours to suit your availability. It's all about being flexible on both sides.

What kind of person do we need? We welcome everyone. You might be a MK-U3A member and/or you might put us in touch with your friends or family, but we do have a few basic criteria:

- You must be reliable as you can imagine, if we have planned for a team of 8 and only 4 turn up, it gives us a very big problem.
- You must wear a smile we value our reputation above all else, so we insist our team are professional, presentable and happy!
- You must be at least a little bit fit we will never ask you to do more than you say you can, but whilst it's fun, you will still be on your feet for a few hours.

Finally, should your family be interested, we can only have people over 18 years old due to insurance restrictions.

What's in it for you? Apart from enjoying time in the fresh air, having some exercise, getting to see live music for free plus being fed & watered, you will also get paid. For every shift, we will pay an hourly rate that is above minimum wage. This may vary according to the times/day, and there are various ways we can do it:

- We can pay you directly with real money
- We can pay into another account on your behalf eg a Junior ISA held by a grandchild etc

- We can make a donation to a charity or good cause of your choice
- We can make a donation to a MK-U3A group of your choice
- We can use the accumulated amount earned by you alone or perhaps a number of you to buy something of your choice, for example an instrument for a musical group, or a piece of equipment for a practical group, or perhaps we can fund a day out or visit for a special interest group

The choice is entirely yours; we would just like to make our request for help as attractive as possible and we'd be very happy to discuss any other ideas you may have.
