Bournemouth and the Isle of Wight 2 October to 6 October

24 of us spent a lovely week in Bournemouth, visiting Basildon Park, the Isle of Wight for Osborne House, Beaulieu Motor Museum and House, a morning in Winchester, a tour of Bombay Sapphire and Greys Court.

The weather was kind to us, warm and sunny most days.

Whilst there I received an e-mail from City and Village Tours, a company we have used many times over the years for day trips, with an offer of a short break to Potters Resort Hopton on Sea Monday 18 to Friday 22 March 2024 at a cost of £639 fully inclusive including drinks, 4 meals a day, entertainment, and activities with no single supplements. 14 places for singles, including single- and 2-bedroom bungalows plus twin and double rooms. There are 48 places in total based on a minimum of 25 places.

Deposit of £100 by the end of November, with the balance due by Friday 9 February 2024.

But there are people out in the community, perhaps preparing for retirement, or are lonely or new to the area, who don't know about us. 
It is planned to hold the meetings on the 1st and 3rd Tuesday morning of every month in Newport Pagnell.

Danesborough Chorus Autumn Concert - Sian Rees

Saturday 25th November 2023, St Mary's Parish Church, Woburn, at 19.30. Rutter *Gloria* Bruckner *Motets* Patterson *Magnificat*

For the opening concert of our 49th season, Danesborough Chorus is joined by organist Paul Carr and the Tim Hawes Brass Ensemble for a performance of John Rutter's *Gloria*, one of his most popular choral works. Paul Carr is a freelance organist and recitalist whose concert and recital schedule takes him all over the UK. Trumpeter Tim Hawes has played with the majority of the UK's major symphony orchestras including the Milton Keynes City Orchestra where he was principal trumpet. He is currently principal trumpet with Alina Orchestra.

Paul Patterson's *Magnificat*, a work written for brass ensemble, percussion, and organ, is both dramatic and exciting, displaying rhythmic variety and instrumental colour.

The programme will also include three glorious motets by Anton Bruckner: Locus iste for unaccompanied choir, Afferentur regi for choir and trombones, and the majestic Ecce sacerdos for choir, trombones and organ which may be familiar to listeners as it was performed by the Monteverdi Choir at the coronation of King Charles III in May 2023.

Instrumental pieces for brass ensemble and organ will also feature in the concert.
