
The 4,000 mile Redway Walkers

As it says in the group title, we walk on the Redways, which are a wonderful feature of this beautiful city of Milton Keynes. With over 200 miles of red tarmac pathways there is plenty of choice of traffic free routes. We aim to complete circular routes of 5 miles which takes about two hours every Tuesday morning. We can often complete a five mile walk without crossing a main road, a feat possibly unique to Milton Keynes.

There are over 50 members in the group and the average weekly attendance is 16. We are open to new members. So far in 2022 we have completed 49 walks. We cancelled one week due to the heat in July and one walk to frost last week. On 20th December the members in this walking group had walked a total of 4,075 miles in 2022 and we still have one walk to go.

There are other walking groups in the U3A that do shorter walks, or longer walks further afield so there is plenty of choice. Walking on the Redways means there are no styles to clamber over and usually no muddy sections, so no special equipment is required and we try not to lose people.

We have a number of members who take it in turns to lead the walks, and they will go over the walk a few days in advance to check that it is all clear. Each Sunday morning one of the joint group leaders sends an email to all members giving the start point of the upcoming Tuesdays walk, so if you need an idea for a New Year's resolution, why don't you join us?



A Literature Class in Milton Keynes – January to March 2023

This class should appeal to those who are keen on discussing good literature with a highly experienced tutor and a more structured format than is usually possible in book groups. The tutor, **Karen Hewitt**, taught regularly for Oxford University Department for Continuing Education, but a change of policy by OUDCE and the WEA has meant that she is now running these classes in Milton Keynes independently with a continuing group of about a dozen class members.

Literature and Science in the twentieth century

The class will study a number of significant works that bring together science and literature during this period: Berthold Brecht's play *Life of Galileo*; William Golding's novel *The Inheritors*; Michael Frayne's play *Copenhagen*; and Alison MacLeod's short story *The Heart of Denis Noble*. (NB A science background is not necessary for this class.)

Time and Place The class will be held on Mondays from 10.00 to 12 noon **starting on 9**th **January 2023.** It will last for 11 weeks with a half term booked provisionally for 13th February. The class will be held in the comfortable **Methodist Church Hall in Stony Stratford**.

Fee The fee for the 11-week class will be £160 to cover paying the tutor, travel expenses, hire of hall and insurance. Potential new members are welcome to come along to the first meeting as a free 'taster', before deciding if they would like to continue.

RETURN OF THE MUSIC LECTURES TO MKU3A

After Covid19 so rudely interrupted our very enjoyable music lectures, we are now thinking of resurrecting them again as part of our MKu3a programme of activities in 2023.

If there is sufficient interest, we would commence the programme this spring and the anticipated dates would be:

8 March

12 April

10 May

14 June

Led by Adrian Boynton, Director of Music at Milton Keynes City Church, the spring series is anticipated to consist of four lectures, each lecture lasting for two hours, (so eight hours of music in total).

The lectures would commence at 1.45 and end at just after 3.45 (depending on how leisurely our coffee break becomes).

The venue would be the Oak Tree Centre on Shenley Brook End (easy, free and plentiful parking).

In order to cover our fixed costs, the price that members pay would depend on the numbers that are interested in attending. The more people attend, the cheaper the series becomes.

We had built up a good number of attendees before COVID19 stopped us all in our tracks so the prices had become reasonable. I'm hoping that if we go ahead, and if there are enough of us, we can keep the price of each lecture at £4 or less.

Likely topics might include:

- Concerto From Beethoven To The Present Day
- Dance Music Through The Ages
- English Musical Revival In The Late 19th And Early 20th Centuries (Parry, Stanford, Elgar, Vaughan Williams, Holst)
- French Masterworks, Baroque To The Present Day (Couperin, Rameau, Lully, Berlioz, Franck, Faure, Debussy, Ravel).

Still Green's 29 apartments for over-50s at the Love Wolverton development will include one fully accessible apartment designed to be suitable for a wheelchair-user. A leaflet providing detailed information about this apartment has been produced to advertise this opportunity to enjoy living in a cohousing community. You can find the

The apartment can be easily personalised by making simple adaptations. Depending on the time of reservation, the person reserving the flat will be able to make arrangements to customise the kitchen through our developer, TOWN, as part of the building contract, or make their own arrangements for adaptations to suit their needs once construction has been completed.

Six other apartments are also still available for purchase and four will become available for social rent in due course.

Still Green holds regular open meetings when we welcome anyone who wants to know more about us. In January we have our AGM for members so our next Open Meeting is on **Saturday 18 March 2023**.
