If you haven't set up your log in details yet, you can find instructions for this on 'Login' tab of the MKU3A website.



MK U3A - Making Changes to your Personal Details

- 1. Open the MK U3A website (mku3a.org)
- 2. Login to the site. (If you haven't set your login password yet please see the instructions on the LOGIN page.)
- 3. Once you are logged in 'click' on the Control Panel icon top right of screen



4. This will open a page showing the following icon. 'Click' on the icon



5. You will now open a page showing your personal profile. This is where you can change your contact details and add an emergency contact. This is extremely important in cases of accident or emergency. Make any changes necessary and 'click' Save Changes top or bottom right of profile screen.



6. You now have two options – Returning to the Website or to Logout. Top right of screen. Select the appropriate icon.

A very informative presentation was given at the February Open Meeting on the training of medical detection dogs. Rowland, an MKU3A member and speaker volunteer, together with Sarah, a socialising volunteer and Toby, a black labrador told us all about this charity.

The Medical Detection Dogs Charity is local to Milton Keynes with the headquarters in Great Horwood and has been running for 10 years. It is completely reliant on donations and an army of volunteers.

Rowland had brought information leaflets and several fund-raising items, pens, notelets and badges together with a collection box.

Members were very generous. £39 was raised from sales of merchandise, £137.17 was placed in the collection box and with a larger audience than usual, despite the weather conditions, a donation from MK U3A of £100 was made, a total of £276.17 was raised for the charity.

Our new Musical Director, Mark Jordan, conducts this mix of well-known and unfamiliar 18th Century music, with the talented Alex Aitken on organ and the Chorale Chamber Orchestra.

Handel wrote the majestic and dramatic Zadok the Priest for the coronation of King George II in 1727 and since

then it has been performed at every coronation of a British monarch. **Let Thy Hand be Strengthened** contains both lyrical and rousing movements. **The King Shall Rejoice** is the grandest and most extensive of the anthems, with an exhilarating 'Alleluia' as its conclusion.

Composed in the early 1700's, Emanuele d'Astorga's moving **Stabat Mater** became one of the most frequently performed choral works of the eighteenth century, and this concert offers a great opportunity to experience it alongside music of the same period.
