Message from the Communications Co-ordinator

Just a word of warning about an online scam which caught out a friend of mine. Luckily she was able to rectify the problem with swift action.

In brief, my friend received an email purportedly from iTunes, this is an account that users of Apple iPads, iPhones or Apple Mac computers use to purchase music or apps.

The email stated that they were checking whether a purchase costing £89 was legitimate. If it wasn't she needed to open a link and to report it.

During the reporting procedure she was asked to add the card used for this account again to verify her identity. She did this and then had second thoughts so contacted Apple by phone to check the veracity of the email. On hearing that they had not sent the email she took immediate action and cancelled the card with her bank. Luckily there had been no time for the scammers to use her card for purchases.

The email looked genuine but we all know that we shouldn't give out personal data and card details. One of our members, Celia Hart, has asked me to recommend that U3A members watch the BBC TV programme or visit the website of 'Rip off Britain'. Older people are the target for many internet scams that steal identity and money fraudulently, and these are exposed by the presenters to help us avoid being victims of crime. The 'how to stay safe with internet banking' and 'how to protect your computer, identity and passwords', tips from experts are very useful as apparently even a house sale can be at risk.
